Title: Online Screening for Postpartum Depression: Pilot Study (P20NR009009) Role: Primary Investigator. Period of award: 7/1/08-6/30/09 Sponsor: NIH - NINR Rural Health Care Research Center.

The goal of this study was to develop and test an innovative online screening tool designed to improve the identification of postpartum depression in women. The research questions for this study were: 1) Can an online, web-based screening tool be developed based on existing PPD screening instruments? 2) How will postpartum women respond to this kind of screening (accessibility, satisfaction, response rates), particularly in rural, underserved areas?

Title: Building Community Partnerships to Advance the Care of Women with Postpartum Depression Role: Co-Investigator. Period of award: 7/1/09-6/30/10 Sponsor: NIH - NINR Rural Health Care Research Center.

This sustainability project includes a conference (“PPD: Next Steps in Screening, Referral, Treatment, and Research”) and research grant review session designed to reach large numbers of providers across the state and begin to mobilize them in a more coordinated effort to address this health issue. The goal of this conference is to help build relationships with a wide variety of providers and community organizations throughout the region who all share an interest in Postpartum Depression (PPD). Building these relationships is important to advance clinical care by stimulating new ideas, providing a shared a focus on a common clinical problem seen by many disciplines, across many settings, and can be very helpful in building effective research teams and health care provider networks.
